Learning Objectives — *Participants will: 1) attain an initial understanding & application of the Integrative Model of Supervision; 2) learn how to ethically address content & process in supervisory sessions; 3) utilize the skills involved in creating appropriate ethical structure for supervision while actively encouraging supervisees to be involved in the supervision process; 4) acquire the skills to effectively address interpersonal dynamics between themselves & their supervisee in an ethical manner, including how to solicit & effectively use feedback from the supervisee; 5) learn strategies to ethically support & challenge supervisees with specific & useful feedback regarding the supervisees clinical skills; 6) gain knowledge to assist supervisees in identifying & working through personal issues & biases in ethical situations that impact their delivery of clinical services.*

About the Instructor — *Allan Goldberg, PhD., has been in clinical practice for 25 years specializing in supervision, LGB issues, men & intimacy, & adult development. Dr. Goldberg was the Director of Training at the University of Pennsylvania's Counseling & Psychological Services Center where he was responsible for the development & implementation of their APA Approved doctoral psychology internship as well as an extensive training program for psychology practicum & post-doctoral trainees, graduate social work students & physicians completing their rotation in psychiatry. Dr. Goldberg received his Doctorate in Counseling Psychology from Temple University & has been an adjunct faculty member at University of Pennsylvania, Graduate School of Education & Graduate School for Social Policy and Practice.*
